- VA Spinal Chord Unit Update from Bob McMahon:

On Thursday, August 22, I visited the VA Hospital's Spinal Cord Injury Unit's courtyard gardens to see how the vegetables, herbs and flowers were faring that club members planted in May. VA Hospital staff member, Alexandria Simmons and veteran Todd accompanied me as I toured the courtyard. I am happy to report that the tomatoes, eggplants, and peppers have been producing very well, and are being utilized by the kitchen. Alexandria told me that the kitchen recently made eggplant Parmesan that was a big hit! Alexandria told me that the kitchen was not accepting the green beans, and she did not know the reason why. The bean plants are fading but still producing some beans. All the white onions have been harvested and the leeks are now ready for harvest. The kitchen also has been using the basil, oregano and thyme, and tea is being made out of the lemon grass!

The flowers are looking great for this time of year, and I did some deadheading, explaining to Todd and Alexandria what to look for regarding faded flowers that need to be removed to promote more flowering. The two Kong coleus planters are spectacular with their huge colorful leaves! Late next month, garden mums, kale and pansies will be purchased from the Lakewood Garden Center and will be planted to replace fading annuals and vegetables. As I was leaving on Thursday, both Alexandria and Todd thanked me and our club profusely for our efforts to provide nutritious vegetables and herbs and the colorful flowers in the courtyard and how much it meant to them. That is what this project is all about!
